

# Practicing Licence – Labour Mobility

## Purpose

Labour mobility applicants for a Practicing Licence are defined as persons that have successfully challenged the Canadian approved MLT entry to practice examination(s) and are or were registered and working as a MLT in another regulated jurisdiction in Canada.

Document checklist	
Criteria	Details
<b>Letter of Standing</b>	The applicant must request a letter of standing from each Canadian MLT regulatory body they have been registered with in the previous 5 years.
<b>General requirements for registration</b>	English language – Letter of Standing* generally meets this requirement.  Record check – see <a href="#">Record Check Policy</a>  Government issued photo ID - see <a href="#">Photo Identification Policy</a>
<b>Evidence of MLT Education</b>	Letter of Standing* generally meets this requirement.
<b>Entry to practice exam</b>	Letter of Standing* generally meets this requirement.
<b>Currency of MLT Practice</b>	Continuing Professional Education. See <a href="#">CPE Policy</a> and <a href="#">Guidance Document</a> for details.  Practice hours requirement. Letter of Standing* generally meets this requirement. See <a href="#">Practice Hours Policy</a> and <a href="#">Guidance Document</a> for details.
<b>Professional Liability Insurance</b>	Applicants must have professional liability insurance. See <a href="#">Professional Liability Insurance Policy</a> for details.
<b>Jurisprudence quiz</b>	Applicants will receive the jurisprudence manual and quiz after they have completed and paid for the application.

*\*In cases where the Letter of Standing does not provide the necessary detail, the college can request additional documents.*
